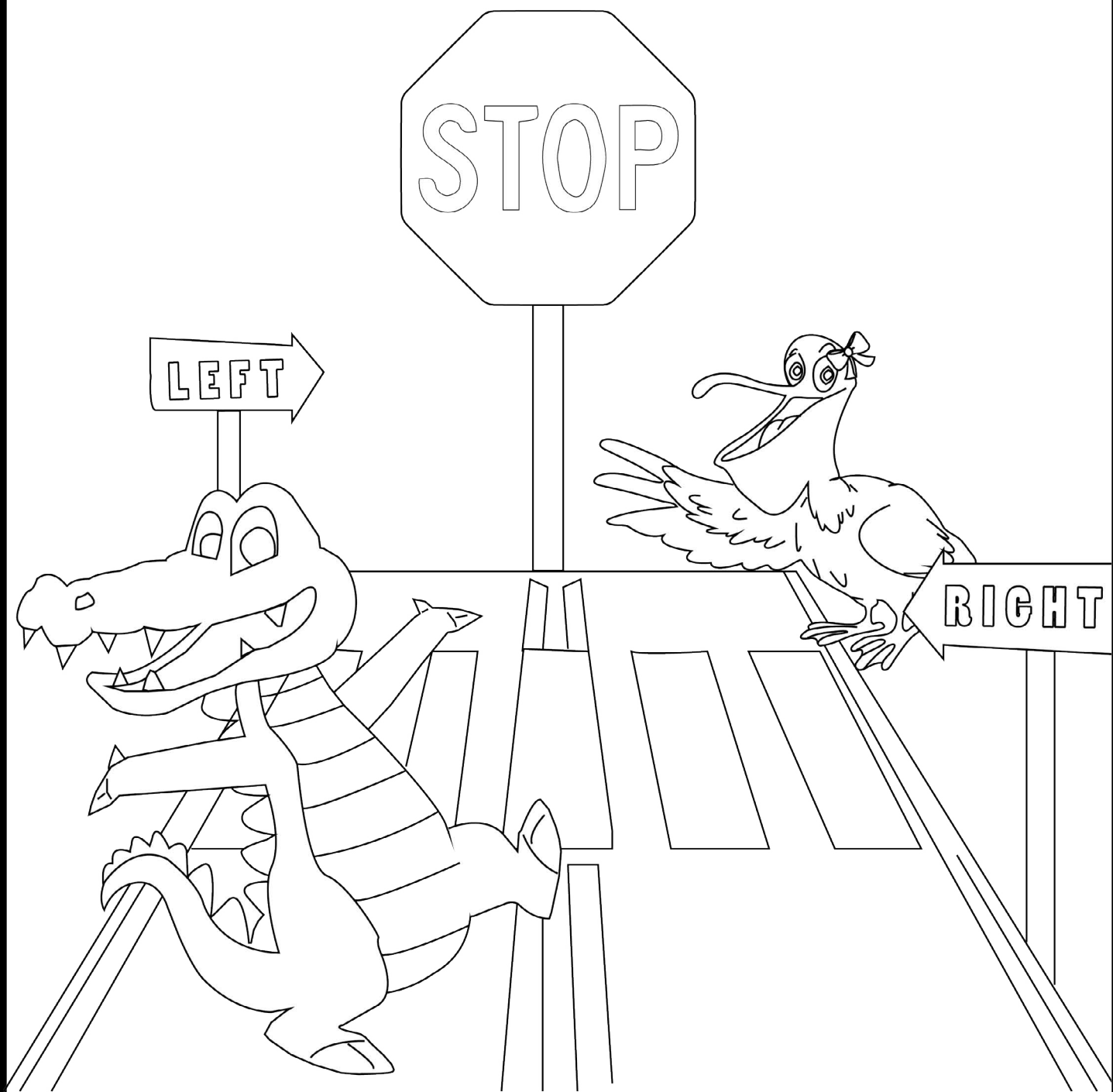


Whenever you go out to play, take a buddy and

LOOK and LISTEN always.

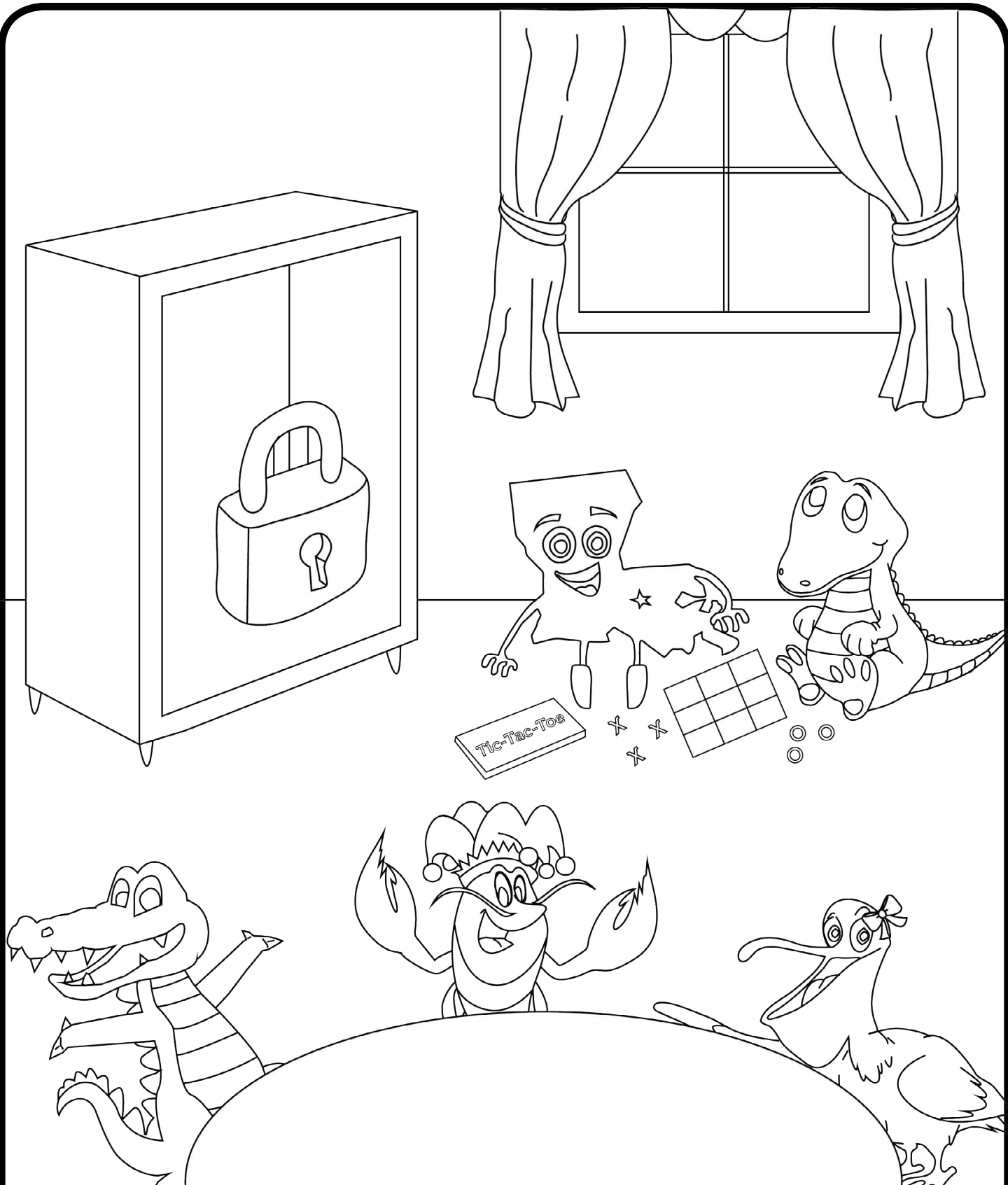

# Life Jacket

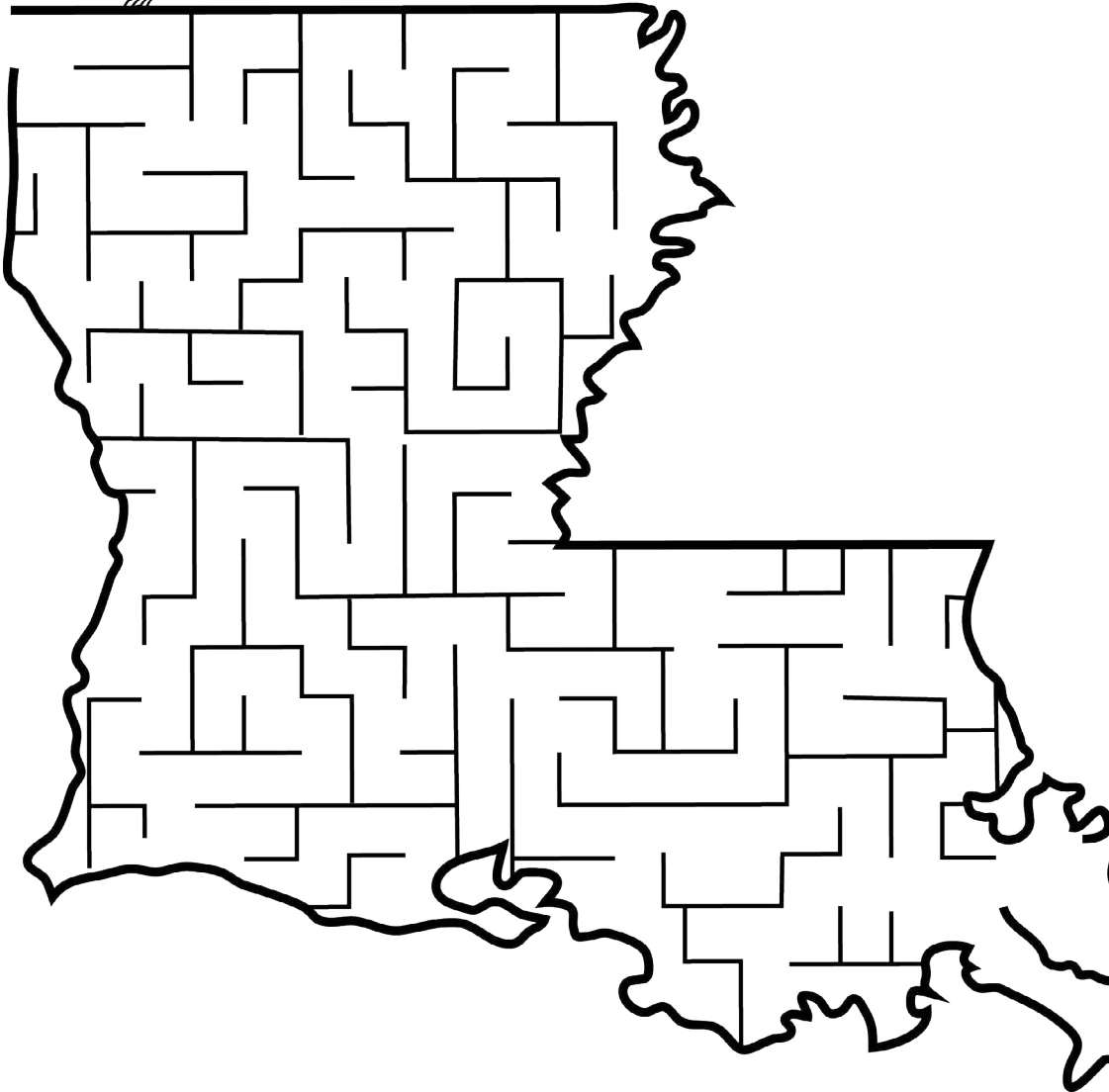
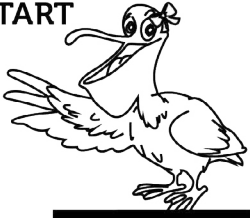
Make sure everyone on your boat has a life jacket that is in good shape with no holes or tears. Check the life jackets each time before use.

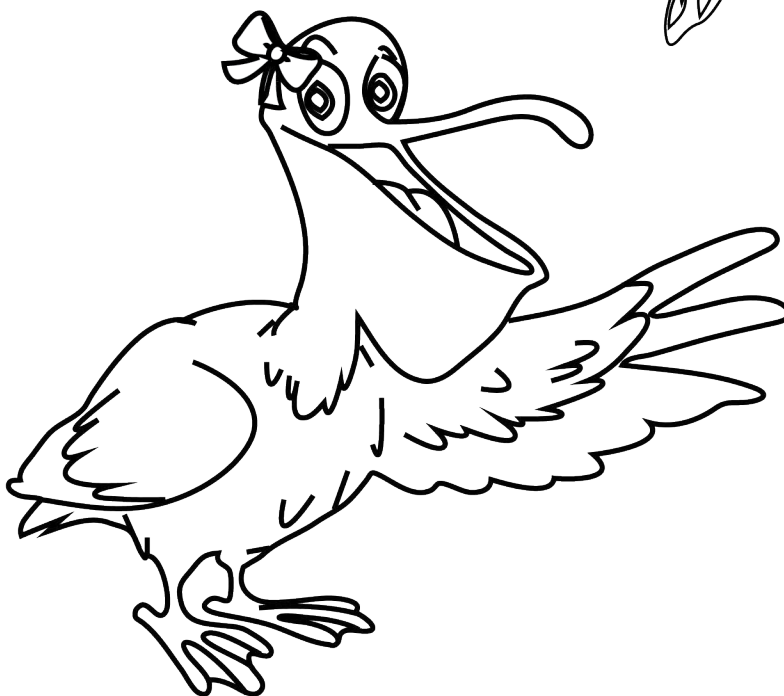


THE LOUISIANA
